3. We have publishing services!

We have resources available to help you along your publishing journey, from print to digital, for purchase or open access, and articles to books.

4. We provide copyright assistance!

The University Copyright Office (UCO) is available to provide information and guidance on using copyrighted works for teaching and research, and advises on the creation of copyrighted works to faculty, staff, and students.

5. We can assist with systematic reviews!

We offer opportunities for systematic reviews and knowledge synthesis.

6. We provide course assistance!

We have subject liaisons available to support you, your assignments, and your coursework, and can create course reserves, add library reading lists to your Brightspace course, incorporate streaming video in your courses, request print material, and find or develop a library research guide for your course.
