

TOP 10 THINGS FACULTY SHOULD KNOW ABOUT PURDUE LIBRARIES AND SCHOOL OF INFORMATION STUDIES



1. We can help you publish open access.

We have resources available to help you along your publishing journey, from print to digital, for purchase or open access, and articles to books.

2. We have a data repository and data management services.

The Purdue University Research Repository (PURR) provides a data-sharing and publication platform and specialized data management and curation services to support Purdue researchers.

3. We provide research impact support.

We offer consultations and workshops to extend the impact of your research. Topics include selecting high impact journals that contribute to Purdue's rankings, setting up an ORCID account, etc.

4. We offer consultations to support your work.

Subject librarians provide consultations for systematic and other literature reviews, grant proposals, new research areas, and advanced database searching. The University Copyright Office also offers guidance on using and creating copyrighted works for teaching and research.

5. We subscribe to journals and databases.

We provide access to subscriptions like Scite.ai and The New York Times with your Purdue login.

6. We support graduate research.

The Libraries Graduate Research Information Program (GRIP) provides workshops, both live and on-demand, to help graduate students find, organize, share, and preserve research data.

7. We provide course assistance.

We can help you create course reserves, add library reading lists to your Brightspace course, request materials, and find or develop a library research guide for your course.

8. We have an institutional repository to provide online publishing support.

Purdue e-Pubs boosts research impact through Green Open Access repository services, such as publisher policy review, copyright compliance, metadata collection, and accessibility support.

9. We have archives.

The Virginia Kelly Karnes Archives and Special Collections Research Center is on the fourth floor of HSSE library in Stewart Center. See collections on Amelia Earhart, Neil Armstrong, and other alumni.

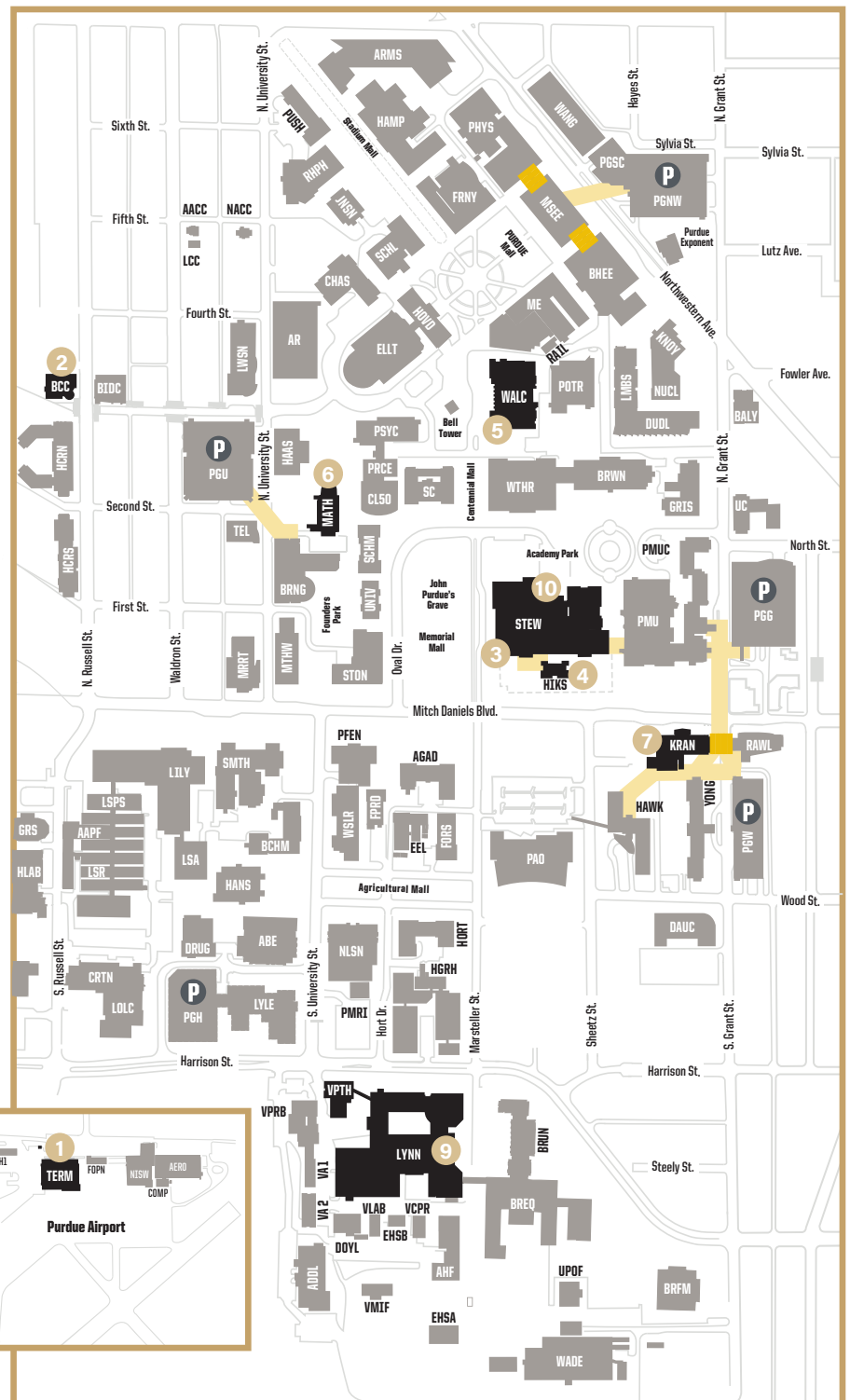
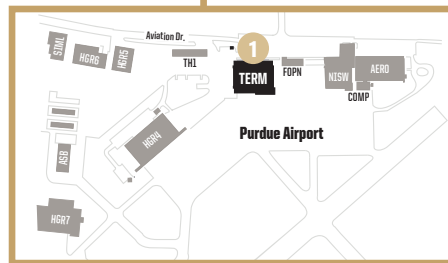
