1. Know before you go.

OpenSeat tracks the amount of available space on each floor throughout almost all of our libraries on campus to help you decide where to study.

2. We have reservable study spaces.

Reserve study spaces and a testing room throughout our libraries with OpenSeat.

3. We offer a wide variety of resources and services.

Borrow and renew books from Purdue Libraries or through InterLibrary Loan, print, copy, and scan documents, access course reserves, and more.

4. We subscribe to journals and databases.

Purdue Libraries provides access to many subscriptions such as Scite.ai and The New York Times. All you need is your Purdue login.

5. We offer an undergraduate minor.

The School offers a minor in information studies that enables students to utilize information and data effectively across professional and academic contexts.

6. We have scholarships.

Libraries has seven student scholarships for student employees and students on a certificate track.

7. We hire students.

A number of student employment opportunities in Libraries are available each academic year. Federal work-study applicants are preferred, but all students are welcome to apply.

8. We have a Knowledge Lab.

The Knowledge Lab (WALC 3007) is a rapid prototyping maker space where the Purdue community can use a variety of materials, equipment, and software to experiment with their ideas.

9. We hold Purdue's archives.

The Virginia Kelly Karnes Archives and Special Collections Research Center, on the fourth floor of the HSSE library in Stewart Center, houses collections on Amelia Earhart, Neil Armstrong, and more.

10. You can eat and drink in the libraries.

Food and drink are allowed in all libraries and vending machines are located in the HSSE library in Stewart Center, the Parrish library, WALC and in the Student Center in Indianapolis.

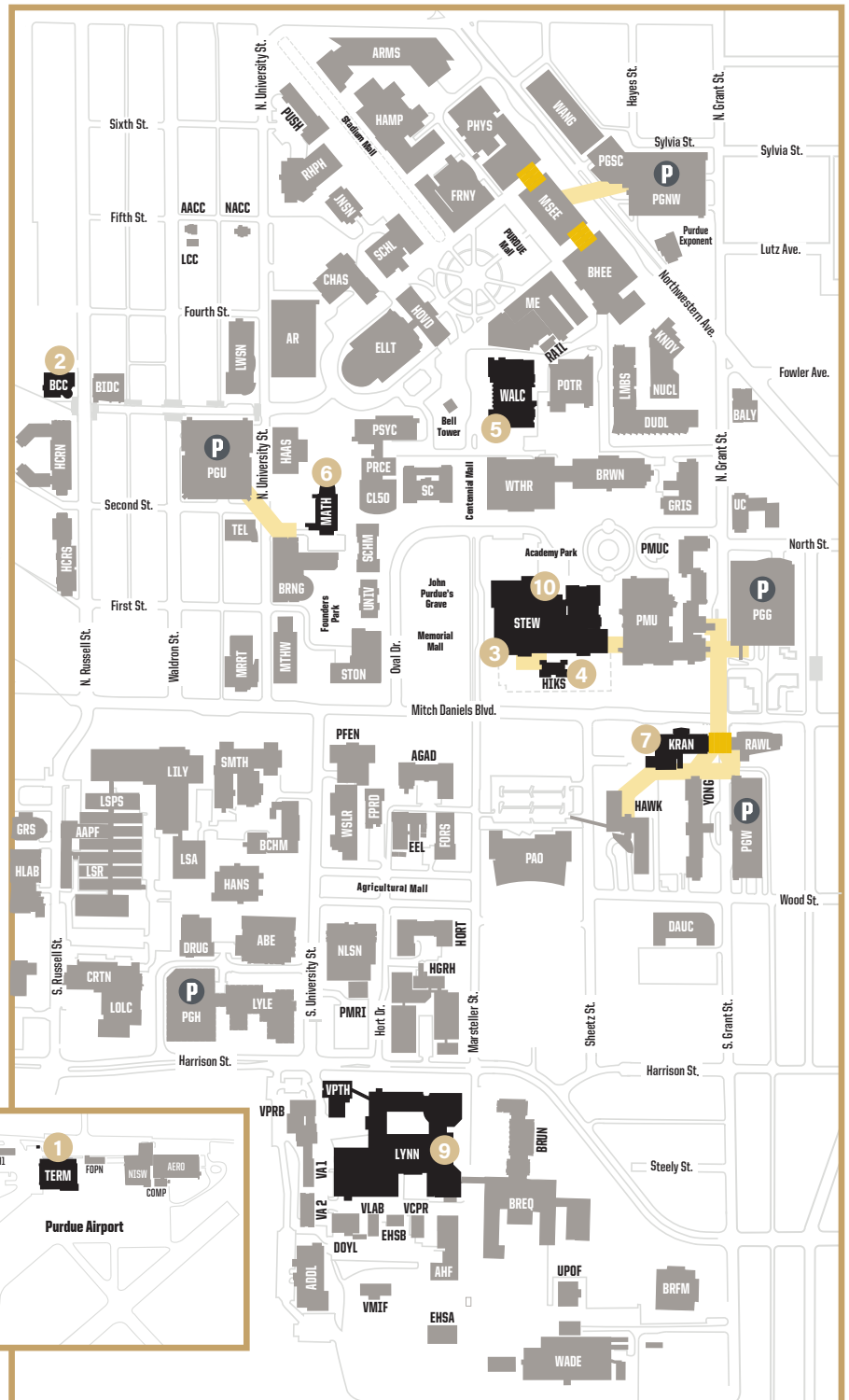
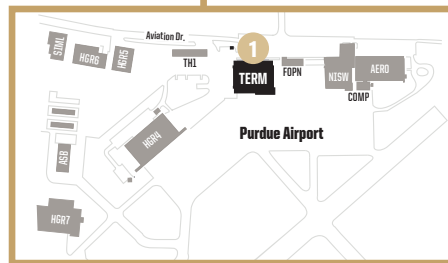
